



Call for applications for the Autonomous Tutorials for the winter semester 2021/2022

The ASTA Marburg offers eight autonomous tutorials in the **winter semester 2021/2022**. **We** are looking for interested students of the Philipps-Universität Marburg from all departments who would like to offer an autonomous tutorial on a topic of their choice. The autonomous tutorials offer students the opportunity to explore topics together from different perspectives, interdisciplinary and critical, without being bound to the university constraints such as exams.

Each tutorial is remunerated at **€345 per month (30 hours; €11.50/hour)**. The positions are limited until **30th March 2022**.

The application consists of the following parts:

- completed form with information about the applicant (applicant form)
- Cover letter with question
- Announcement text for the tutorial (approx. 250 words)
- Certificate of study/registration

The application form only asks for some core information about the applicants (name, gender (optional), course of study and semester as well as experience regarding the management of a tutorial).

Interested students please apply with a letter of application (max. 2 pages) in which the self-formulated question is presented with which the tutorial is to be explored and which should run as a red thread through the sessions.

The following selection criteria shall apply:

- Autonomous tutorials create a non-curricular teaching offer. Therefore, undergraduate teaching may not be offered.
- The tutorial must be interdisciplinary and should be designed and organised to appeal to students from all subject areas.
- The tutorial should pursue an interdisciplinary topic and/or innovative teaching concept.
- The tutorial should take a critical look at their respective teaching and research disciplines and/or critically reflect on the social context of the sciences.
- The tutorial should meet common scientific standards.

Part of the application is also an **announcement text (max. 250 words)**, which announces the tutorial and is formulated as low-threshold as possible. The application text should provide information on how the interest of potential participants is to be aroused.

Registered students of the Philipps-Universität Marburg from all courses of study can apply. Applicant teams of max. two persons are possible. Only one application per semester is allowed. Doctoral students are only eligible if they do not have a teaching position at the Philipps-Universität Marburg. During the selection process, care is taken to ensure that the tutorials are distributed across as many departments as possible.

The applicants who meet the selection criteria will be invited to a selection interview of about 30 minutes with the committee, in which the concept of the tutorial will be briefly presented by the applicants and then organizational issues will be clarified. The **selection interviews are** expected to take place in mid-October.

The AStA Marburg guarantees the professional equality of women* and men. Applicants with equal aptitude and qualifications will be given preference.

The AStA Marburg is particularly committed to the equality of severely disabled and non-disabled persons and therefore welcomes applications from severely disabled persons. Severely disabled applicants will be given preferential consideration in accordance with SGB IX in the case of equal suitability, ability and professional performance.
