



Call for applications for the Autonomous Tutorials for the summer semester 2023

The ASTA Marburg offers eight autonomous tutorials in the **summer semester of 2023**. We are looking from **1st April 2023** for interested **students of the Philipps-Universität Marburg from all departments (m, f, d)** who would like to offer an autonomous tutorial on a topic of their choice. The autonomous tutorials offer students the opportunity to explore topics together from different perspectives, interdisciplinary and critically, without being bound to university constraints such as exams.

Each tutorial is remunerated with **360 € per month (30 hours; 12,00 €/hour)**. The positions are limited until **15th August 2023**.

The application consists of the following parts (together in one PDF-document):

1. **Letter of application with a question** (max. 2 pages, in which the self-formulated question of the tutorial is presented, with which the tutorial will be explored, and which should run as a common thread through the sessions. In addition, the concept for the semester - what are the learning goals?)
2. **Preliminary session plan** for the semester, from which the didactic concept of the sessions and the learning goals can be identified. (If you are invited to a selection interview, the meeting plan and the associated learning objectives should be presented in a short presentation.)
3. **Announcement text** for the tutorial (approx. 250 words, which advertises and describes the autonomous tutorial. Comes to the ASTA website and is sent via email via the student mailing list.)
4. **Completed form with information about the applicant** (applicant form that asks for some key information about you.)
5. **Certificate of enrollment** (current enrollment certificate)

The following selection criteria apply:

- Autonomous tutorials create a non-curricular teaching offer. Therefore, undergraduate teaching may not be offered.
- The tutorial must be interdisciplinary and should be designed and organized to appeal to students from all subject areas.
- The tutorial should pursue an interdisciplinary topic and/or innovative teaching concept (= open, no frontal teaching 😊)
- The tutorial should take a critical look at the respective teaching and research disciplines and/or critically reflect the social context of the sciences.
- The tutorial should meet current scientific standards.

Enrolled students of the Philipps-Universität Marburg from all degree programs can apply. Applicant teams of max. two persons are possible. Only one application per semester may be submitted. Doctoral students are only eligible if they don't have a teaching position at the Philipps-Universität Marburg. During the selection process, care is taken to ensure that the tutorials are distributed across as many departments as possible.

Applicants who meet the selection criteria will be invited to a 30-minute selection interview with the committee. Applicants will be informed about the time of the selection interview after sending in their complete application.
